

HEALTH AND SAFETY

At Kaleidoscope Camp it is our goal to run a safe, Christ-Centered camp. For this reason all of our counselors are trained in first aid and CPR. While we do not employ a full-time summer Camp Nurse, most weeks we do have a nurse on-call, and many weeks we have a nurse on grounds. All of our nurses have volunteered their time and expertise and we are truly grateful. If you know a nurse who would be interested in volunteering at camp please let us know.

Any time a camper is referred to medical attention outside of Camp, or is restricted from normal program participation for more than 24-hours, parents will be contacted.

All prescription medication brought into Camp should be in their original containers with the original label attached. Please write instructions including dosages and times on an index card or slip of paper to include with the medication. This will assist us in administering the medication in the same way that it is done at home. All medications, including non-prescribed vitamins, creams, lotions, aspirin, etc., must be turned in and dispensed by the Program Director, Assistant Program Director or Camp Nurse. Do not repackage drugs or substitute another person's prescription; this is prohibited by law.

Please do not take your children off of their medication, especially ADD medication, while they are at camp.
